My practice consists of Sports Medicine and Interventional Spine, with my overall goal for each of my patients is to decrease pain and improve overall function so that they can have a higher quality of life. I use a multifactorial and multidisciplinary approach in my treatments, to include therapeutic modalities, medications, and interventions with both ultrasound andamp; fluoroscopic guidance to all levels of the spine, as well as all joints of the musculoskeletal system.

KUdos


